An awareness talk on 'Human-Wildlife Conflict: Reasons, Remedies & Challenges' was organized by Bhoomithrasena Club, Department of Zoology & Environment Club of TKM College of Arts & Science, Kollam, in connection with UN World Wildlife Week 2025. The program was held on 10th March 2025 at 10:00 AM in the Seminar Hall.
